

Dr. Barry Kipperman is a board certified veterinary specialist in internal medicine and was staff internist and founder of a 24-hour referral/emergency practice in the San Francisco Bay area from 1997-2020. Dr. Kipperman received a masters degree in animal welfare, ethics and law from the University of Edinburgh in 2017, and became a board certified veterinary specialist in animal welfare in 2019.

He teaches veterinary ethics at the University of California at Davis School of Veterinary Medicine and animal welfare and ethics for the University of Missouri College of Veterinary Medicine. Dr. Kipperman received the Harrison-Kaplan undergraduate teaching award in 2019 and 2022.

Dr. Kipperman serves on the Animal Welfare Committee of the California Veterinary Medical Association, and is on the Board of Directors of the Humane Society Veterinary Medical Association, and MightyVet, an organization devoted to veterinary wellness. Barry has published essays and research on veterinary ethics for over 20 years. His research interests include the influence of economics on animal welfare and veterinarian well-being, and the ethical dilemmas and moral stress faced by veterinarians.

Barry is the co-editor and co-author of the book, *Ethics in Veterinary Practice: Balancing Conflicting Interests*. Dr. Kipperman is a frequent speaker on veterinary ethics issues at conferences.
